Descriptive Epidemiology of Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease In US Nursing Home Residents with Heart Failure

Multiple chronic conditions are common in nursing home residents, but descriptive epidemiologic studies are lacking. It is imperative to understand how these multiple chronic conditions affect older adults to improve their physical functioning, cognition, and quality of life. This project utilizes the Minimum Dataset, Medicare Master Beneficiary Summary File, and Medicare hospitalization (Part A, MEDPAR) data, which consists of virtually all nursing home residents in the United States between 2002 - 2018. Using quantitative methods, this dissertation provides foundational knowledge of the epidemiology of COPD in U.S nursing home residents with heart failure. The findings from this dissertation highlight the prevalence of COPD among nursing home residents with heart failure, challenges in the clinical management of this multi-morbid condition and the necessary multidisciplinary care approaches to manage COPD, heart failure, psychological distress (anxiety and depression) and associated comorbidities among these individuals.
