Research Methods Meeting Wednesday, May 7, 10:00-11:00 AM

Presenters: Kurt Hager, PhD, Assistant Professor, and Meagan Sabatino, PhD, Instructor, Epidemiology, Department of Population and Quantitative Health Sciences at UMass Chan Medical School

Title: Impacts of Medicaid-Funded Nutrition and Housing Supports on Healthcare Utilization and Costs in Massachusetts

Abstract: Massachusetts was one of the first states in the US to obtain a waiver to allow Medicaid to pay for nutrition and housing programs for medically complex members with food insecurity and housing insecurity. This presentation will focus on new research analyzing changes in hospitalizations, emergency department visits, and total costs of care among 30,000 Medicaid members who received services from 2020-2023 under the Flexible Services Program.



Bio: Dr. Hager's research focuses on structural determinants of health, food insecurity, and nutrition and health insurance policies. He is currently evaluating the Flexible Services Program, which addresses food and housing insecurity under Massachusetts's Medicaid Section 1115 Waiver. Dr. Hager has training in nutritional epidemiology and his recent studies have included policy modeling, economic evaluations, and quasi-experimental studies.



Bio: Dr. Sabatino is a recent graduate of the Population Health Sciences program, where she contributed to data collection and analytic efforts for the independent evaluation of the Massachusetts Section 1115 Medicaid Demonstration. Her current research examines the effects of Medicaid policy reforms on health outcomes among low-income populations, with particular emphasis on individuals with behavioral health conditions.

UMASS CHAN REMINDERS

Use Your Excess Vacation Leave by June 28

As we get closer to fiscal year end, we want to remind you of the <u>UMass Chan Holiday</u>, and <u>Personal and Vacation</u> <u>Time Policy</u> and maximum accruals so you can plan accordingly.

As of the last full pay period of the fiscal year, the maximum number of vacation hours employees may carry over into the next fiscal year is 240. During the fiscal year, employees are allowed to accrue hours over 240. Hours over this accrual limit are automatically re-set in the payroll system to the accrual maximum.

This year, the relevant pay period ends Saturday, June 28, 2025. You are encouraged to use any vacation balances that exceed the 240-hour maximum before that date.

To avoid the loss of accrued vacation hours, review the following recommendations:

- Take all vacation over 240 hours before Saturday, June 28, 2025. Keep in mind that the vacation accrual for the pay period ending on that date that will not appear on your paycheck.
- Any hours over the cap will automatically be reset to 240 and will appear on your paycheck on Friday, July 4, 2025.
- If you are approaching 240 hours of accrued vacation time, talk with your manager about planning time off before June 28 and make sure it is approved by them.

Ensure your vacation time has been entered into the Time Reporting system by June 28, 2025.
