Major Goals: This proposal introduces Persistent Hardware Descriptors (PHDs), specifically in the domain of microscopy images to solve the problem of inadequate metadata capture and storage, which hinders research reproducibility, data integrity, and cross-disciplinary collaboration. By providing a standardized framework for capturing this essential information, the project enhances the reliability of scientific results, makes advanced technologies more accessible, and supports long-term data preservation, ultimately advancing scientific research practices.



Everybody's got a box they're supposed to live in. But some people's boxes got more barbed wire than others Razorblade Tears by S.A. Cosby is a powerful novel that explores themes of grief, masculinity, race, class, and homophobia in the rural American South.

The story follows two fathers—one Black, one white—both former convicts, who set out to para the fige the murder of their married sons. As they confront their own prejudices and past failures, the novel probes the limits of redemption, the complexities of identity, and the societal forces that shape violence and intolerance.
