"Black Men's Health: Hidden in Plain Sight"

Presented by: Roland J. Thorpe, Jr., Ph.D. Associate Professor Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health



Abstract: Dr. Thorpe is an Associate Professor at the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health, and holds joint faculty appointments in the Department of Medicine, Division of Geriatric Medicine and Gerontology, and the Department of Neuroscience, Johns Hopkins Center to Reduce Cancer Disparities, Center on Aging and Health, Center for Innovative Care in Aging, and Hopkins Center for Health Disparities Solutions, all at the Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions. His research focuses on understanding of the etiology of race- and SES-related disparities across the life course in

functional and health status of community-dwelling adults with a focus on African American men. Dr. Thorpe currently serves as the Co-Director (with Dr. George Rebok) of the NIA-funded Johns Hopkins Alzheimer's Disease Resource Center for Minority Aging Research (JHAD-RCMAR). He is a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America. He is a past recipient of the JHSPH's Advising, Mentoring, and Teaching Recognition Award, and the inaugural annual 2018 NHLBI OHD PRIDE Roland J. Thorpe, Jr. mentoring award.
