In late June, Dr Maykel attended the COLOR III Investigators Meeting in London, England representing the US research sites. COLOR III is a Phase 3 international clinical trial for rectal cancer patients looking at surgical procedures. The Division of Colorectal Surgery at UMass Memorial was the first research site in the United States for the COLOR III Trial. Dr Maykel was an early adopter of the transanal TME (TaTME), a specific surgical technique used to improve the quality of resection in the management of complex rectal cancer patients.

Drs. Paulo Martins, Babak Movahedi, Aaron Ahearn, and Adel Bozorgzadeh recently presented their work "Intentional Transplantation of Hepatitis C Positive Livers into Hepatitis C Negative Recipients—First Reported Case Series in the English Literature" in oral form at the Annual Meeting of the International Liver Transplant Society (ILTS) in Portugal. The work was also featured in a second

presentation by the organizing committee, called "The Best of the ILTS," as one of the most interesting papers of the meeting.

In collaboration with the Pathology Department, the group also presented additional work at the same meeting, entitled "Telepathology in liver biopsy for transplant: The value of smartphone and microscope adapter for real-time expert evaluation."
